Background on Comprehensive Transportation Safety Planning

- Federal Transportation Legislation
 - ◆ Safe Accountable Transportation Equity Act A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU)
 - Requires comprehensive safety planning on both the state level and the MPO level
- State of Montana
 - Comprehensive Highway Safety Plan (required)
 - Focuses on the Four E's (Education, Enforcement, Emergency Medical Services & Engineering)
 - Major goal to reduce fatalities and incapacitating injuries on the roadways by half by 2030
- City of Hamilton
 - ◆ Hamilton Area Transportation Plan (2009 Update)

Community Transportation Safety Plan

- Desired to complement goals and objectives found in the State of Montana's Comprehensive Highway Safety Plan
 - Data driven and reflective of the needs and issues of the local community
 - Aggressive public outreach component and community buy-in
 - Identifies community safety issues and concerns
 - Defines an implementation strategy to mitigate identified transportation safety problems to achieve goals and objectives
 - Focuses on the Four E's (Education, Enforcement, Emergency Medical Services & Engineering)

Community Transportation Safety Plan Purpose

To identify and address local safety issues such as:

- Seat belt usage
- Alcohol and drug impaired driving crashes
- Young driver crashes
- ♦ Truck crashes
- Emergency medical services delivery
- Older driver crashes
- High crash corridors/locations
- Motorcycle crashes
- Local safety issues

Transportation Safety Oversight Committee

- Comprised of local officials and stakeholders with a role in transportation safety
- Represents various aspects of the Four E's
 - Provide oversight and input
 - Assist with defining issues and concerns
 - Support the formal adoption of the Plan
 - Work to implement the final adopted Plan
 - Assist in the monitoring and tracking of progress to reduce crashes within the Hamilton area
- During Plan development, committee will meet monthly for six (6) months


Development Process
