Thank you for the hard-work and detailed presentation on Tuesday evening!! I now understand why these projects take so long from start to finish.

I am a "hometown" boy of 56 years and for the last 28 years have worked at Stockman Bank. I am also a retired Sidney Volunteer fireman of 20 years. My office sits on the corner of Central Avenue and West Main Street.

**Comment #1**---with regards to safety and common sense---I have witnessed many accidents and near misses due to the 4 lanes of traffic on central avenue. The three lane idea is GREAT!!!

**Comment #2**---the commercial truck traffic on Central Avenue has created unsafe ruts, potential hazardous material spills, fire, and explosions. We have been very fortunate to avoid anything catastrophic. Any solution to move these trucks from Central Avenue will make our pedestrians, businesses, and moving traffic safer!!

**Comment #3**---I have tried to digest the conceptual corridors and preliminary analysis presented Tuesday night. I think I was fairly open-minded going into the meeting.

Trucks coming from the west on the Culbertson Highway---I think a straight shot to the post-office intersection is the best route—when they get to the intersection (for which we need a light and bigger turning area/radius)—they can either cross to the east truck route (existing) or turn north to the Fairview Highway—thus avoiding downtown central avenue. Trucks coming from the North Fairview Highway would come all the way to the post-office intersection and either turn east or west to either truck route.

Trucks coming from the south on the Glendive Highway---I like the idea of having them turn east by Great Plains and then North parallel to the railroad tracks and then coming onto the east truck route (9<sup>th</sup> Ave). This takes out the commercial trucks and farm to market trucks that now have to all go past the high school area. This also opens up for the future—some industrial growth along both sides of the truck route that turns east at Great Plains.



Dear Carol:

I would like to submit for the record some pertinent facts concerning the proposed truck route and downtown renewal project for Sidney, MT. The late 70's early 80's City-Co planning board retained the engineering firm Marrison- Marlie to study and present a comprehensive plan for Sidney and the surrounding community. The study was to update a 1972 study plan that was outdated shortly after completion. The purpose of the study was to provide orderly growth, expansion, and prevent hit and miss sporadic development. Cost 25,000.00. Their planning suggested that Sidney would have a population of 13,000 by the year 2000. Didn't make it. They cautioned, "watch out for the tendency to get out of the city and prevent development outside the city limits in a crazy quiet pattern of land uses which is not desirable." Strip development tends to rob the downtown area of its main commercial function and should not be allowed. Do not desert the downtown support it. There wasn't much effort extended toward a transportation plan. The Richland County planning board contracted with Carmin Associates of Billings who hired Leigh Scott and Cleary of Denver to prepare a complete transportation plan for the City of

Sidney and Richland County. This study was completed and delivered to the City and County May 20 1983. The study was very complete and offered much for consideration and direction.

Such things as: Truck Route, Urban Growth, Conceptual Street Plans, Major Arterial Streets, Minor Arterial Streets, Collector Streets, plus much more.

I would like to offer the following for consideration. Starting at highway 16 North, exit east to County Road 126 travel east on 126 cross highway 200 and connect to a re-aligned county road 351. Connect to 9<sup>th</sup> avenue Northeast travel south to 14<sup>th</sup> street Southeast continue approximately 1500 feet past 14<sup>th</sup> South, turn right and travel westerly connecting to highway 200 at a 90 degree configuration. Install a stop light.

#### Items to consider:

- Eliminates truck traffic on Central Ave.
- o Eliminates a need for stop light at Central Avenue and Holly Street.
- Convert Central Avenue to 3 lanes.
- Eliminate stop lights at
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Street Southwest & Central Avenue
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Street Northwest & Central Avenue

This will eliminate a number of problems that presently exist. 1. The problem at the intersection at Central Avenue and Holly Street. 2. Remove the truck problems on Central Avenue.

3. Eliminate the congestion at 14<sup>th</sup> Street Southeast, highway 200 & 16 South. 4. Reduce the excessive build-up of the traffic on Holly Street West. 5. Most of all, the improvement of safety

RE: Proposed Truck Route Changes: Sidney, Montana

Dear Ms. Strizich;

I am writing to you to comment on the proposed changes to the truck route in Sidney, Montana.

I am a resident of Sidney and have lived along the truck route for nearly 40 years. I am opposed to all three of the design suggestions brought up at the public meeting in Sidney on Thursday March 12, 2009 as are most of my neighbors. The general consensus appears to be relatively simple. Most people would be satisfied with, or approve a plan, to make repairs to the existing route on the north and south corners and installation of a traffic light at Holly Street near the Sidney Post Office. I strongly support altering Central Avenue through the downtown of Sidney and making this a three-lane road. Having recently driven through towns that have this configuration on the main highway through their downtowns it is easy to see how much better this would be than our present four-lane setup. The first concern I have is for safety of the people crossing Central Avenue and for those that park along the sides of this street. When I first moved to Sidney, I noticed that some people park their vehicles with two wheels up on the sidewalk. I quickly realized this was to avoid being sideswiped or losing a mirror. Wider lanes would allow more clearance for those parking and driving. When large trucks use Central Avenue through town, the road in reality becomes a two-lane road. There is not room for another vehicle to drive safely next to the truck so people either speed up to move past the truck, which isn't safe, or they stay behind the truck until they are through town.

I know that change is hard for some people but sometimes change can improve what we have. The proposed changes will improve traffic through the downtown and will also be beneficial to the business and assist with growth in Sidney.

For this change to work, some improvements will be needed on the existing truck route. The present truck route does not take much longer than going down Central Avenue. If a stop light was installed on the corner of Central Avenue and Holly Street, safety would improve and trucks could easily move back onto the highway going either west or north.

I would urge you to move forward with the reconstruction of Central Avenue into a much-needed change to three lanes.
