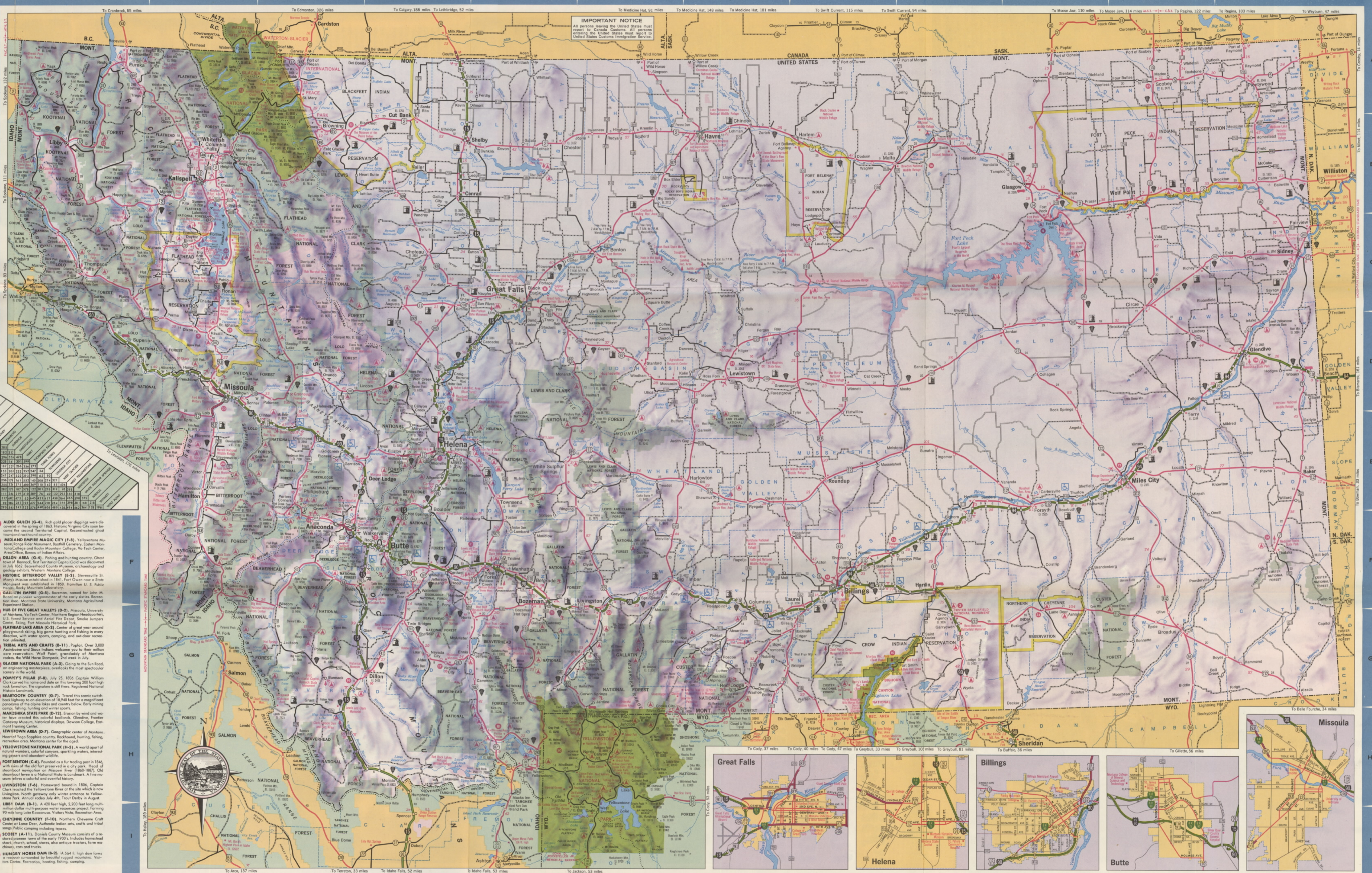

POINTS OF INTEREST

1. LAST CHANCE GULCH (F-4). Gold was discovered on July 14, 1864. This territorial and present State Capital, State Capitol Building and National Museum and Library, visitors welcome. Conducted tour of Helena by Last Chance Tour, Canyon College, Veterans Hospital, Mountain View School, State Library, Governor's Old Mansion, Wo-Teh Center.
2. RICHEST HILL ON EARTH (F-4). Gold, silver, copper, and iron mines and open pits. World's most famous 33 acres of history and industry of mining. Open for public viewing. Western Museum and Technology, Wo-Teh Center.
3. CUTLER BATTLEFIELD NATIONAL MONUMENT (G-9). June 25, 1876. Battle of the Little Bighorn. General George A. Custer and his Seventh Cavalry were slain to the last man by the combined Sioux and Cheyenne Indian forces. Annual battle re-enacted on weekend several anniversary dates. Cutler Agency, Crow Indian Reservation.
4. FORT PICK DAM AND RESERVOIR (C-10). Boating and fishing. World's largest earthen dam extends the Missouri River forming reservoir 189 miles in length with over 1,000 miles of shoreline. Recreation areas.
5. GATES OF THE MOUNTAINS (D-4). Discovered and named July 18, 1805 by Lewis and Clark. Scenic view of 2,200 feet above the Missouri River. Abundant with interesting wildlife, deer, bear, bighorn sheep, and golden eagle, fish, elk, pronghorn.
6. GREAT FALLS OF THE MISSOURI RIVER (C-5). Discovered in 1805 by Lewis and Clark. Great Falls, world's largest waterfall. Scenic view of 2,200 feet above the Missouri River. Abundant with interesting wildlife, deer, bear, bighorn sheep, and golden eagle, fish, elk, pronghorn.
7. LEWIS AND CLARK CAVERNS STATE PARK (F-5). One of the nation's largest limestone caverns. Cultural education, recreation, fishing and hunting provide an exciting 90 minutes guided tour.
8. MASON CANYON EARTHQUAKE AREA (H-4). At 11:37 a.m. on Oct. 17, 1959, an earthquake shook the earth in Madison, Idaho, creating a great dam and Quake Lake. Memorial, educational center and visitor.
9. NATIONAL BISON RANGE (D-2). Large herd of bison, also elk, pronghorn, whitetail and mule deer. Some longhorn cattle and moose spotted elk and moose. Conducted guided tour over game land only Labor Day.
10. TELEMTANTAL DAM AND BIGHORN CANYON NATIONAL RECREATION AREA (G-9). Multi-million dollar 500 foot high dam. Memorial, educational center and visitor. East river, boating, fishing and recreation.
11. MUSEUM OF PLAINS INDIAN (B-2). An exhibition and center center depicting the life of the Northern Plains Indians on the Big Horn River. Open July through September under supervision of the Indian and Civil War.
12. COW CAPITAL OF THE WEST (E-11). Range Riders Museum, a memorial to the cowboy. Annual rodeo, rodeo grounds, annual rodeo and May backing horse sale. Miles Community College, Five Mile Square, Range Riders Experience, Indian and Veterans Affairs.
13. ST. ISIDORE MISSION (D-2). Established in 1854 for the Flathead Indians. The present church is said to be the first stone church in the West. A site of a very rewarding experience.
14. MIDCOTE ROCK STATE PARK (F-13). 220 acres containing midcote rock. Annual rodeo, rodeo grounds, annual rodeo and May backing horse sale. Miles Community College, Five Mile Square, Range Riders Experience, Indian and Veterans Affairs.
15. GEORGTOWN LAKE AREA (F-3). Backcountry, ghost town, canyon, fishing, hunting. World's largest smelter stack of Anaconda Mines.
16. BOWNAN NATIONAL WILDLIFE (B-9). Abundant with resident and migratory waterfowl. Canadian geese, ducks of all species, colorful nesting birds, and upland game birds. Also waterfowl, deer and occasionally even elk.
