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

Tom Haines

Tom Haines is an award-winning aviation journalist who spent nearly 30 years as the Editor-in-Chief and Senior Vice President of Media at the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association (AOPA), the world's largest aviation organization.

A native of Pennsylvania, Haines earned his pilot certificate in his late teens and has logged more than 4,000 hours. He holds a commercial pilot certificate with multiengine, instrument, and seaplane ratings, and holds type ratings in the Eclipse 500 and Cessna CJ business jets and has a second-in-command type rating in the North American B-25 Mitchell. He owns a Beechcraft A36 Bonanza.



Haines holds a Master degree in Business Administration from Mount St. Mary's University and a bachelor's degree in Journalism with a Communications Media minor from Indiana University of Pennsylvania.

As part of his role at AOPA, Haines oversaw the publication of *AOPA Pilot* magazine, the world's largest aviation magazine; *Flight Training* magazine, a magazine specifically for student pilots and flight instructors; the weekly AOPA ePilot electronic newsletter; the Flight Training edition of ePilot, AOPA Online; and the association's video-on-demand channel, AOPA Live. His reporting and personal travel has taken him to all 50 states and all seven continents.

Under his leadership, the media properties have won many industry-leading awards. His writing has earned him awards from the Associated Press and American Society of Business Publication Editors. In 2010, the Bahamian government named Haines as its Travel Writer of the Year. In 2023 he was inducted into the Living Legends of Aviation, an elite group of aviation and aerospace influencers. Also in 2023, he was awarded the NBAA Ewald Platinum Wing Award for Lifetime Achievement in Journalism.

Although he retired from AOPA in 2022 after 34 years, he is still actively involved in many aviation and public servant pursuits for AOPA, Redbird Flight Simulations, Pilot Workshops, and the South African nonprofit group Elephants, Rhinos & People.

Lincoln Airport Gets Upgrade

The Lincoln airport, owned by the MDT Aeronautics Division, is building a snow removal equipment building. The building is funded 90% by FAA grant money and will include a general aviation terminal (pilot rest area). The terminal section of the building will have a bathroom, shower, sink, and seating area. The project is underway and is estimated to be finished in September of 2025.

The building will house existing snow removal equipment for the airport and a new airport snowplow (also primarily funded with FAA grant money) scheduled to arrive in the fall of 2025.



Balloons and Airliners at Glacier International Airport

Sky Ballon Rally in Billings
among other events around
the country.

Montana Aircraft and Pilot Registration Renewals Due March 1st

ACTION IS REQUIRED BY AIRCRAFT OWNERS ON ALL AIRCRAFT REGISTRATIONS EACH YEAR, SO PLEASE BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR MAIL

Aircraft customarily kept in Montana, as well as any aircraft with a Montana address on its FAA registration, must be registered with the MDT on or before March 1st every year (or within 30 days of purchase date for any aircraft purchased). A statutory penalty for late registrations must be assessed in the amount of five times the registration fee if payment OR signed affidavit for exemption with supporting documentation is not received by the deadline.

PLEASE POSTMARK OR TIMESTAMP YOUR REGISTRATION PAYMENTS OR AFFIDAVIT FOR FEE EXEMPTION <u>WITH REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION</u> ON OR BEFORE MARCH 1.

Fee exemptions:

- Aircraft out of annual inspection are not considered "unairworthy" as defined by administrative rule and are subject to annual registration fees.
- If the aircraft is owned by a dealer, a copy of your valid FAA dealer certificate must be received by the due date along with the affidavit.
- If you sold your aircraft, you must submit a copy of the FAA Bill of Sale by the due date along with the affidavit.
- If the aircraft is based out of state, MT registration fees are due unless the aircraft is registered in another state. A copy of the out-of-state registration must be submitted by the due date along with the affidavit. If the state the aircraft is based in does not require registration, MT registration fees are due.
- If the aircraft is operated by an airline company with regularly scheduled service, a copy of the 121 air carrier certificate
 must be submitted by the due date along with the affidavit.

Please remember that registration and late fees apply for paperwork not received or incomplete paperwork, submitted by the March 1st due date, even if you no longer own the aircraft.

New CFI Regulation Sparks FAQ

The FAA implemented new Certified Flight Instructor (CFI) renewal criteria and removed CFI certificate expiration dates, effective December 1, 2024. This new rule has prompted many flight instructors whose certificates expired before the rule change date to ask if they can now renew utilizing the criteria under the new rule.

The short answer is no. Previously expired CFI's wishing to renew their certificates must successfully complete reinstatement practical test check rides as before. For more information on the new regulation, see page 2 of the November edition of *Montana and the Sky.*

2025 Flight Instructor Refresher Course

The annual Flight Instructor Refresher Course (FIRC) will be held in Helena at the Doubletree Hotel from 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on February 7 - 8, 2025. Doubletree hotel is located at 22 N. Last Chance Gulch, Helena MT 59601, phone 406-443-2200.

This course fulfills the renewal requirements for certified flight instructors and includes FAA renewal. Even if you are not a certified flight instructor, you can still attend and learn valuable information as a pilot. The cost of tuition is \$75, but if you are a registered pilot in Montana, you can get a \$25 discount. If you are not currently registered with the MDT Aeronautics Division,

you can register for \$10 per year and save on the FIRC tuition. State law requires Montana pilots to be registered with MDT Aeronautics.


