• DUI Courts - Where Community Safety and Rehabilitation Converge



- 67% of fatalities involved an impaired driver
- 4,536 impaired driving convictions reported to Motor Vehicles
- .20 BAC average for an arrest, when blood is submitted to the crime lab
- PNA and YRBS indicate declines youth driving impaired and riding with an impaired driver

# **Strategy Highlights** Support stronger impaired driving laws

House Bill 133 – Commission of Sentencing Proposed/Passed Legislation

- Modified requirements of the Assessment Course Treatment (ACT)
- Provides treatment court as an option for 4th DUI Offenders (Felony)
- High Blood Alcohol Content alone is not sufficient to charge Criminal Endangerment
- Persistent felony law provisions were modified

# DUI Court Operational Tune-up Trainings and Foundational Trainings from NCDC


- May 2017 Five Montana DUI Courts received an Operational Tune-up training

### **Strategy Highlights** Increase usage of the 24/7 DUI Monitoring Program

- 54 out of 56 counties
- Current number of active participants are 786 individuals are currently in 2x daily breath testing and many more on SCRAM monitoring
- Two reservations have taken the necessary steps
- Two additional reservations are considering implementing the program



Support increased compliance with mandatory alcohol/drug treatment, and an increase in treatment options, to prevent DUI Offenses.

- HB 95 Passed This will increase access to behavioral health, increase local treatment options.
- Impaired Driving Assessment Implementation Montana Department of Corrections. 85 correctional professionals trained.
