



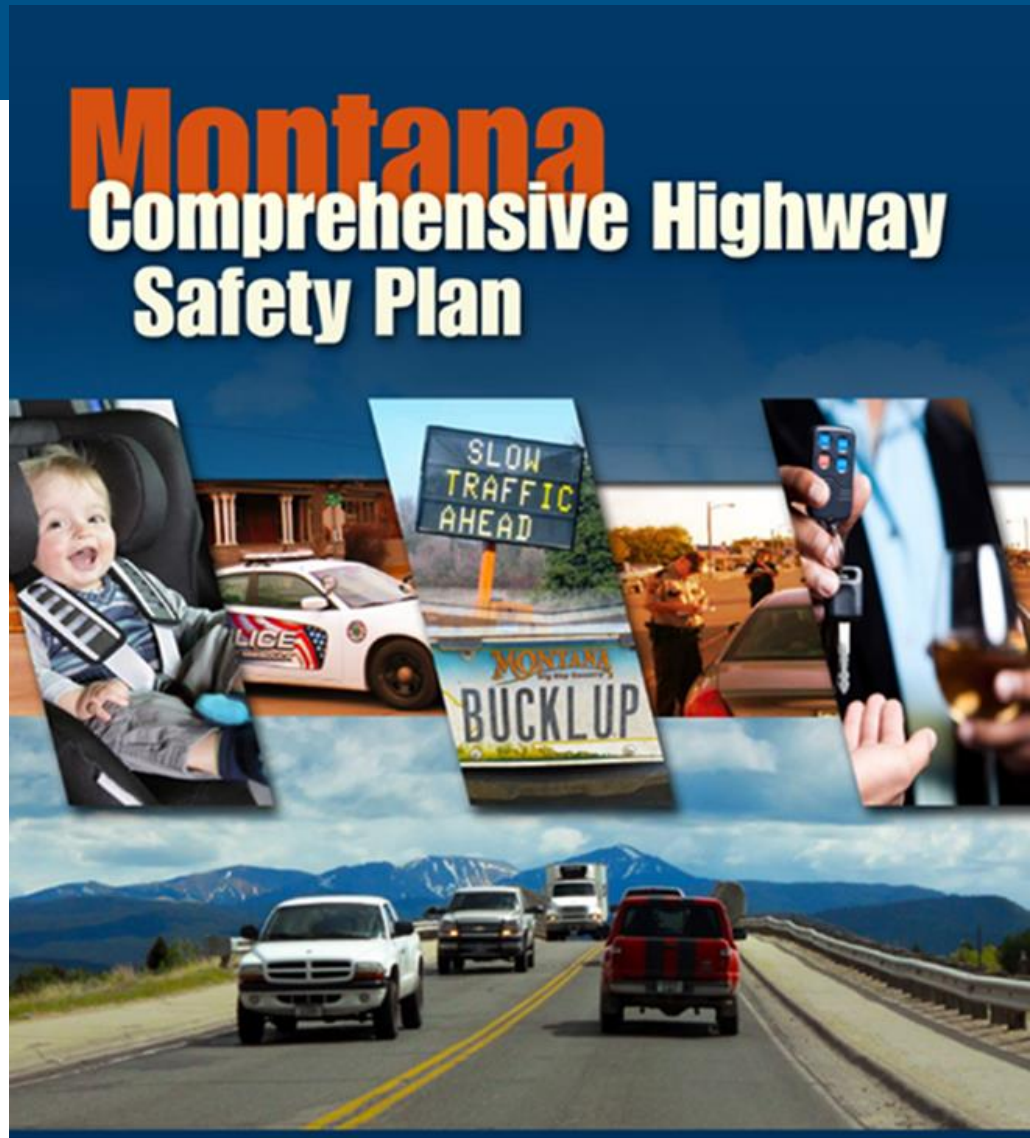

Lives Lost

In 2017 there were 186 roadway fatalities

- 124 involved a roadway departure
- 17 were intersection related
- 114 involved an impaired driver
- 84 were unrestrained
