Montana's Differential Speed Limits

- Montana is the only state with differential speed limits on two lane roadways.
- Uniform speed should reduce long lines &
- Reduce high-risk passing behavior
- Most road users are supportive of uniform two lane speed limit of 65 mph.
- Trucking industry is supportive of uniform speeds.



Based on collective findings the uniform speed limits are recommended for two-lane highways.

Upcoming Legislation

Primary Seat Belt Law Montana Roadway Fatalities, 2017

- 186 fatalities on Montana's Roadways
- 84 of those fatalities were not wearing a seatbelt
- 76 of those occurred in rural crashes
- 55 of the 84 unrestrained fatalities were ejected
- \$ 1.5 million is the average cost associated with one fatality on Montana's roads.

The Vision for Montana is Zero- Zero Fatalities and Zero Serious Injuries on all public road in Montana.

- Data Driven


Federal Outlook
