 Traffic Incident Management (TIM) is the planned and coordinated multi-disciplinary process to detect, respond to, and clear traffic incidents so that traffic flow may be restored as safely and quickly as possible.

Incident Responder Safety Training

- The National TIM Responder Training Program was designed to promote consistent training of all responders to achieve the three objectives of the TIM National Unified Goal (NUG):
 - Responder Safety
 - Safe, Quick Clearance
 - Prompt, Reliable, Interoperable Communications

- Save Lives!


MCA 61-8-346: Motorists must either move over a lane away from emergency vehicles OR slow down at least 20 mph below the posted speed limit.




TIM Training Program Implementation Progress Total Trained - As of September 23, 2019
