




Montana's Comprehensive Highway Safety Plan

To facilitate collaboration, communication, and coordination among highway and traffic safety programs and partners to align goals and leverage resources across Montana to reduce deaths and life changing serious injuries resulting from roadway crashes.

Montana Interim Goal


Reduce fatalities and serious injuries on Montana's roads by half, from 952 in 2018 to 476 in 2030.

Challenges


Implementation of safety efforts, including education outreach and enforcement contact in 2020 was limited and hindered by COVID.

When it comes down to it, no one wants their family and friends to be a killed or to suffer a lifealtering serious injured.




Revive & Renew Vision Zero Initiatives

- Lack of staff & resources across al agencies & organizations
