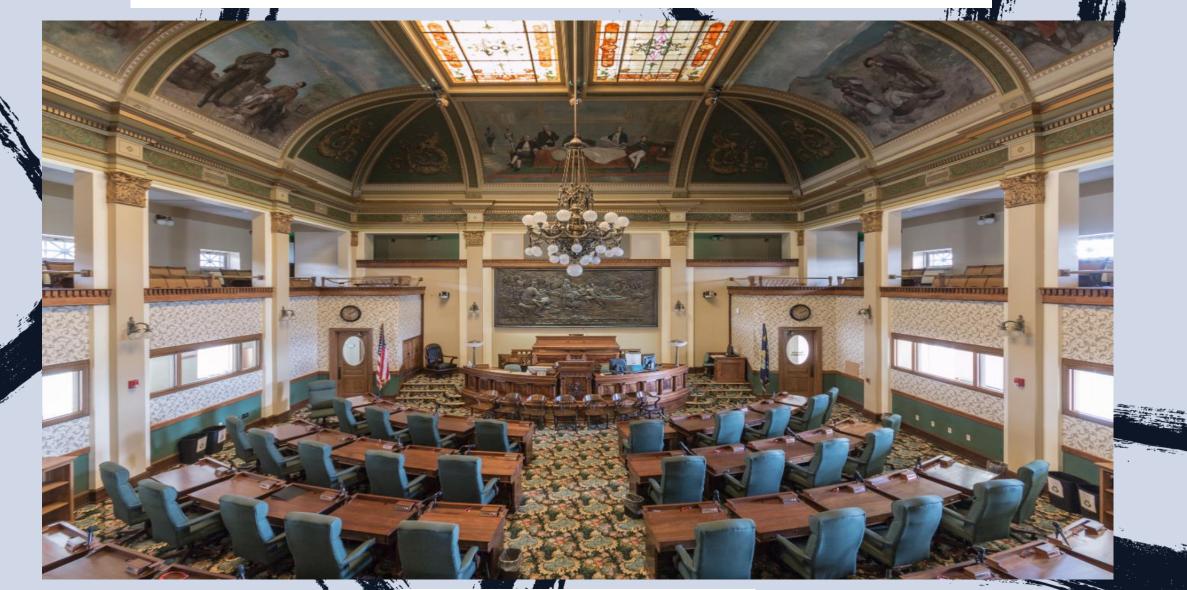
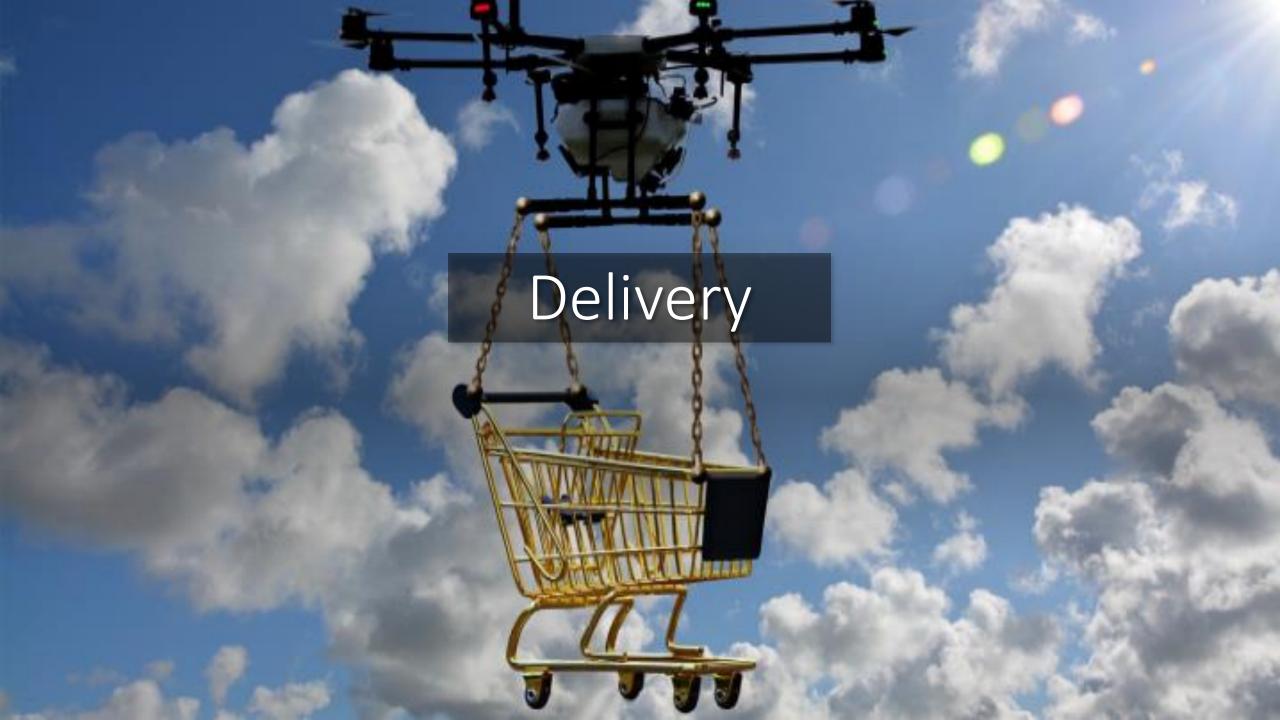
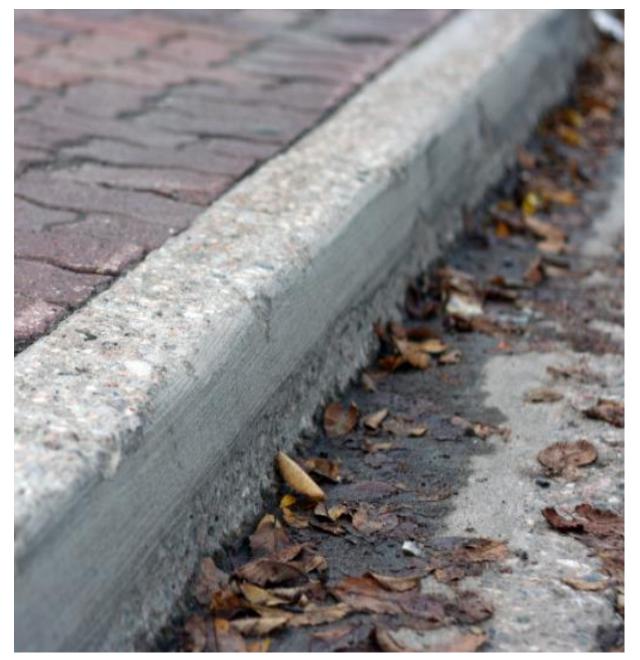

#### **Drive Through Window and Curbside Pickup**

Curbside pickup and drive through windows are areas where alcoholic beverages are carried to a consumer that were ordered online or through the phone from an agency liquor store or licensed alcoholic beverage business. The conveyance of alcoholic beverages at the curbside pickup area may only be provided to a consumer who is within 300 feet of the licensed premises or agency liquor store and a drive through window must be on the licensed premises.

#### Allowed:

- · Accepting alcoholic beverage orders online or though the phone.
- The drive through window and curbside is meant for pickup of those alcoholic beverages ordered online or through the phone.
- Selling alcoholic beverages in original packaging, prepared servings, or growlers depending on the type of establishment or license held.
- Transporting alcoholic beverages through a drive through window within the hours the licensee is allowed in statute based on the type of establishment or license held if ordered ahead of time online or through the phone.
- Carrying alcoholic beverages curbside within the hours the licensee is allowed in statute based on the type of establishment or license held if ordered ahead of time online or through the phone.

#### Not Allowed:

- Ordering alcohol at the drive through window of the premises or agency liquor store.
- Consuming alcoholic beverages sold for off premises consumption on the premises.
- Ordering alcohol at the curbside area of the premises or agency liquor store.

#### Specific License Conditions:

• Brewery and Distillery Licenses: prepared servings count towards sample

Responsible Server And Sales Training Program

16-4-1006. Responsible server and sales training program. (1) The department shall certify all server and sales training programs that include the following:

(a) effects of alcohol on the human body;

 (b) information, including criminal, civil, and administrative penalties, related to 27-1-710 and this code;

(c) procedures for checking identification;

(d) procedures for gathering proper documentation that may affect the licensee's liability;

 (e) training for skills to handle difficult situations and to learn evaluation techniques regarding intoxicated persons or others that pose potential liability;

(f) a final test; and

1. ...

(g) a certificate of completion, which must be provided to participants who pass the final test.

(2) The department may not provide a responsible server and sales training program.

### What is server certification

Anyone who sells or serves alcohol on or off premise in Montana, by law and rule must have passed a state approved training and test.

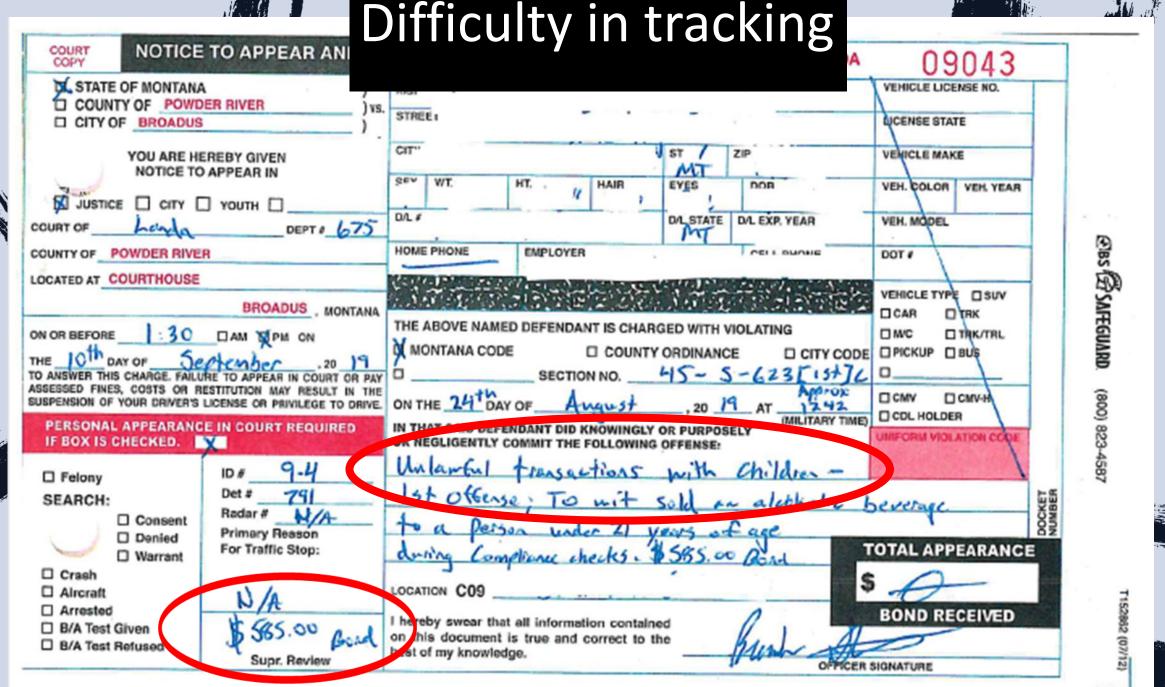
Act was amended on December 20, 2019 to raise the legal age for the purchase of tobacco from 18 to 21 years of age.

1992, Congress enacted the Alcohol, Drug Abuse, and Mental Health Administration Reorganization Act (*P.L. 102-321*), which includes the Synar Amendment (section 1926) aimed at decreasing youth access to tobacco. act and enforce laws prohibiting the sale or distribution of tobacco products to individuals under 18 years old. To determine compliance with the legislation, the amendment requires each State and U.S. Jurisdiction to conducts of retail tobacco outlets and to report the findings to the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). States that do not comply with the requirements set forth in the amendment are subject to Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) Block Grant funding. Federal law dictates that Montana must reach an 80 percent compliance rate in order to retain Federal Block Grant Treatment Funds. Compliance is cons of 575 randomly selected, licensed tobacco merchants annually. We use a federally approved process for every aspect of these inspections. As part of the state's commitment to lower the rates of sales to minors, re-insiders found to be in violation during the random unannounced inspections. These inspections are not included in the Synar Compliance Rate calculation, but are helpful in ensuring the future compliance of violating tobacco of state conducts an average of 625 additional inspections that are also not included in the Synar Compliance Rate calculation. This is another strategy employed to lower the rate of sales to minors.

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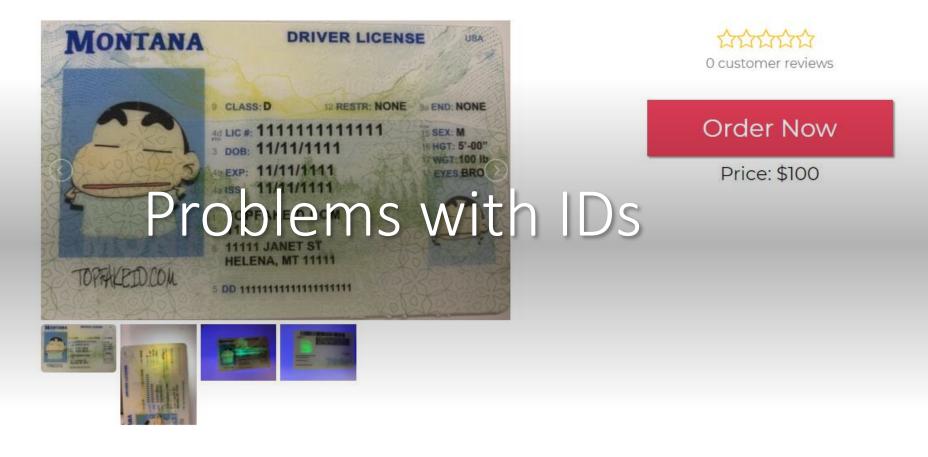

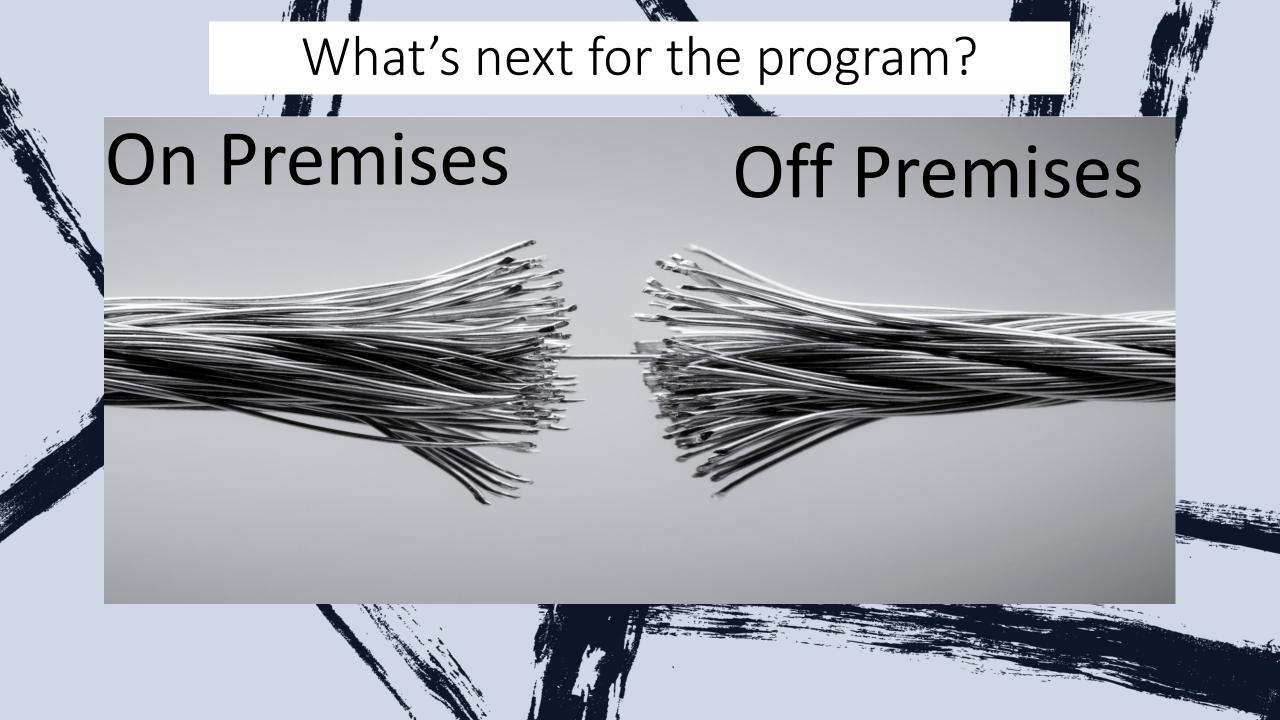
alcohol. Adults are allowed to work at places that serve alcohol at their restaurants or shops. In Montana, a person is considered to be an adult if they are 18 years or older.

People under the age of 21 can drink alcoholic drinks, but the condition is that a guardian or parent must provide it. They can consume it at any private location, but it is vital that drinking should not lead to intoxication.

People under the age of 21 are not allowed to buy alcohol. Use of a fake ID is also illegal and so is its production. Anyone caught buying or selling a fake ID will be penalized. For the
