INCREASED TESTING AND POSITIVE CASES

The average THC level in positive cases for 2021 was 10.4 ng/mL

- The combination of ethanol and THC has the potential for additive impairment
- Canada's per se laws:
 - 0.080 g/dL ethanol
 - ♦ 5 ng/mL THC
 - 2.5 ng/mL THC + 0.050 g/dL ethanol

EMERGING TRENDS

- New forms of THC
- Delta 8 THC: Almost made top 5 drugs in 2021 Q4
- Alcohol and THC: Combination is prevalent
- Fentanyl: Persistent in all casework
- More polydrug cases

- Date from January 1, 2022 September 15, 2022

POLYSUBSTANCE FROM DRE PERSPECTIVE

Involving more drugs

Can be tricky at times to identify all drug categories involved

CANNABIS

- Strains
 - Sativa
 - Indica
 - Hybrids
- Potency
 - Up to 40% THC plus on the plant
 - Extracts up 99% THC



CANNABIS IMPAIRMENT

- Varies by strain
- Gets out of blood quickly
- Can be very long lasting
- Impairment can increase drastically when combined with other substances
