

# THC TRENDS:

# INCREASED TESTING AND POSITIVE CASES

<u>Full Year</u>	Total Positive THC (or metabolite) in DUI <u>Cases</u>	Percent Increase

	Percent increase from 2017-2022	155%

- The combination of ethanol and THC has the potential for additive impairment: greater together than on their own
- Canada's per se laws:
  - 0.080 g/dL ethanol
  - ❖ 5 ng/mL THC
  - 2.5 ng/mL THC + 0.050 g/dL ethanol

- The average ethanol level in positive DUID cases for 2022 was 0.181 gm/dL
- \*This number does not include drivers in traffic fatalities submitted through the coroner/ME system

# <u>FENTANYL</u>

- Synthetic opioid in narcotic analgesic category
- Seeing the analogue: fluorofentanyl
- Increasing in DUI casework, not just postmortem casework

# POLYSUBSTANCE USE FROM DRE PERSPECTIVE

#### 2021 DRE Evals

 30% of evaluations involved polysubstance use confirmed by toxicology

#### 2022 DRE Evals

 38% of evaluations involved polysubstance use confirmed by toxicology

#### 2023 DRE Evals

- 14% of evaluations involved polysubstance use confirmed by toxicology
- 32% of DRE opinions involved polydrug use
- Date from January 1, 2023 September 21, 2023

Involving more drugs

Can be tricky at times to identify all drug categories involved

# FENTANYL

- On the rise in Montana
- Illicitly manufactured
- Most pills are cut with another drug
- Simply taking these pills would be considered poly drug use



# CANNABIS

- Continues to be a popular mixer with other drugs
- More THC variants continue to be identified
- Some variants are significantly stronger than Delta 9 THC
- Products infused with THC continue to increase as well
