Families Acting for Community Traffic Safety is a program designed to reduce traffic - related injuries and fatalities by empowering students to lead peer-driven safety initiatives.





# MT FCCLA TRAFFIC SAFETY PROJECTS Arlee FCCLA

Arlee FCCLA members surveyed students about seat belt use and provided t-shirts, gift cards, and snacks as a prize during an assembly. Their project slogan, #ArleeStrong #BuckleUp and # FCCLA, was featured on the shirts and bracelets.

The event brought together MDT staff, local firefighters, EMS, tribal police, and the Driver's Ed teacher. Guest speakers discussed local accidents, especially those impacting teens. The assembly included a Kahoot Quiz on traffic safety, a student created film and concluded with a challenge for students to take a

safe driving pledge.



# MT FCCLA TRAFFIC SAFETY PROJECTS Huntley Project FCCLA

Huntley Project implemented the FACTS curriculum to plan their traffic safety activities. They visited English and Science classes, presenting a slideshow and using a pretest along with engaging activities such as using the impaired goggles to do a comparison challenge to highlight the how challenging tasks become under simulated impairment.


